
Where DNCs and RNCs **Have Taken Place**

- 6. Why do we have national political party conventions, and what happens at <u>national</u> political conventions anyway?
- 7. How do you think the 2020 COVID-19 online conventions will impact the 2020 election?
- 8. In a way, in this time of social media conventions are a relic of the past, do you think the coronavirus will spell the end of actual physical conventions?
- 9. Now that you have read, internalized, memorized <u>Federalist No. 10</u>, and have become a national expert on James Madison (163 centimeters tall five foot four inches) and his feelings towards factions, explain what Madison would have thought about party conventions.
- 10. If you were the head of the Democratic National Party explain where you would hold the 2024 convention, and if you were the head of the Republican National Party explain where you would hold the 2024 convention. (Pro tip: you're not).
- 11. Based on the silly map above, describe any regional differences in the location of party conventions for the two major parties.
- 12. Explain whether you think national nominating conventions increase or decrease democracy.


Action Extension
