
Growing shares in both parties expect foreign governments to attempt to influence 2020 election



Among those who say it is very or somewhat likely that Russia or other foreign governments will attempt to influence the 2020 election, % who say attempts are a ___ problem




Among those who say it is ____ Russia or other foreign governments will attempt to influence the 2020 election, % who say attempts are a **major problem**
