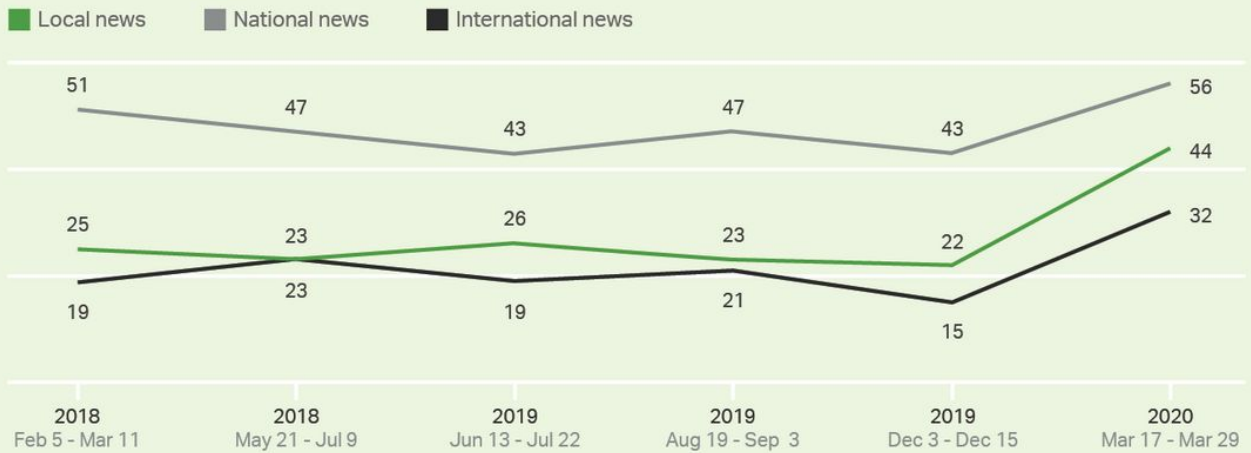


Americans' Consumption of News

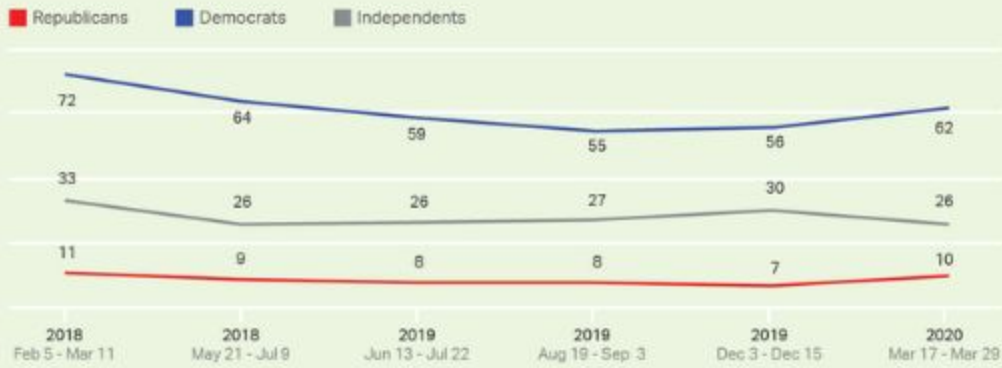
Action Extension

Americans' Low Opinion of the News Media, by Party ID

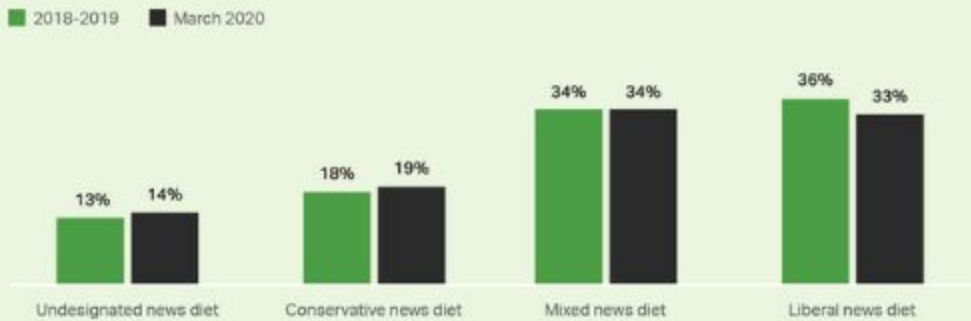
What is your overall opinion of the news media in the United States today? -- % Very/Somewhat favorable

Americans' News Diet Before and During the Coronavirus, by Party ID

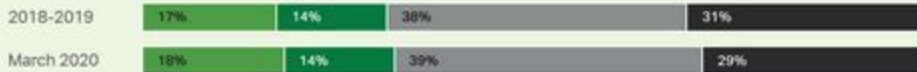

*NOTE: Fewer than 100 Democrats and independents have an exclusively conservative news diet; fewer than 100 Republicans have an exclusively liberal news diet.
